Information Literacy in a new world: exploring concepts of access, sustainability and equity.

17 November 2022, Dublin City University

Call for papers

Our seminar will look at how libraries can progress and lead equity of access to knowledge, skills and resources, and embed sustainable practices in our work. Papers will cover how we view and develop information literacy approaches in this context, presenting new initiatives and experiences relating to practice, models and technology.

The seminar presents an opportunity for those engaged in teaching & learning to share completed and ongoing work and projects, including experiences which have been challenging or have not gone to plan!

Submissions

There are a number of ways to present at our seminar: **Short presentation (10 minutes); Long talk (20 minutes); Poster presentation (authors will be invited to speak about their poster for maximum 2 minutes during the day)**

We would particularly welcome poster submissions this year, offering a valuable opportunity to share your work in a visual format.

We invite submissions that address the following themes - however, all submissions relating to the seminar topic are welcome.

- **Promotion of sustainable practice within information literacy:** including work that supports and embeds the UN Sustainable Development Goals at all levels
- **Creation and use of Open Educational Resources in teaching:** case studies of developing and implementing OERs as part of library teaching, to enhance equity of access
- **Using technology to enhance teaching and learning:** including the use of emerging tools and platforms to advance or repurpose learning support
- **Working within a changed environment:** how libraries have adopted creative approaches to the way we work as teams and individuals, including new ways of offering classes, workshops and other engagement models.

Proposals of maximum 250 words (posters and 10 minute presentations) and 450 words (20 minute papers) should be sent to lisa.callaghan@dcu.ie by **Wednesday 12 October 2022**.

In your submission you should provide:

- Title of your talk
- Summary of key points to be covered
- Relevance of the topic to the theme
- If possible, key learning outcomes for attendees

Submissions will be reviewed by a panel and all who submitted will receive a response indicating if they have been accepted or not by the end of **Monday 14 October**. Informal inquiries can be sent to Áine Carey (aine.carey@mu.ie).
